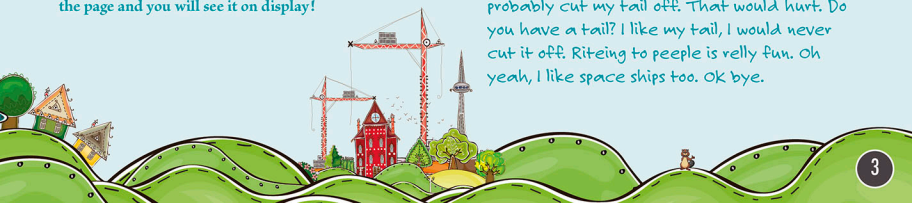

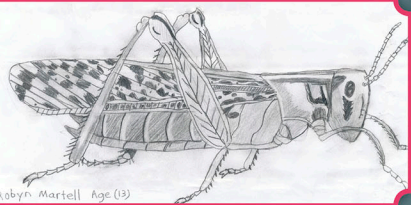

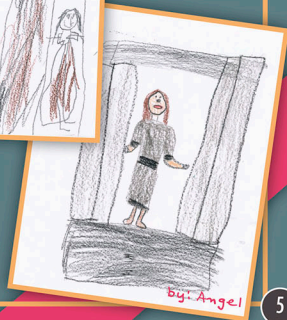

STILL WATERS BUILDING MACHINERY



Whenever you build something, you have to use tools.

Sometimes the tool may be a rock or a hammer, or even just your hands, but you always need tools.

Today we have some great big, powerful tools; much bigger and stronger

than what Nehemiah and Noah used. We have backhoes, excavators, bulldozers, cranes, dump trucks, and more. Some are really good for digging, but can't drive on the road. Others are very good for hauling dirt from one place to another, but they can't dig at all.

Just like people, some tools have things that they are really good at, but they might not be so good at other things. What are some things that you are good at?



BACKHOE

A backhoe can do a lot of different things. It has an arm on the back like an excavator, so it can dig pretty big ditches and holes. On the front, it has a bucket that can scrape up the dirt and dump it somewhere else. They are smaller than excavators, so they can't dig as deep, but they have a bucket, and can drive much faster.



MOTOR-GRADER

A motor-grader is long and skinny, like a giraffe. It uses a blade that sits underneath it to smooth out dirt, usually for a road. They don't do very many things, but the things they do, they are really, really good at. A motor-grader is usually the last machine you use before you pave a road.



DUMP TRUCK

A dump truck is like a car with a really huge trunk. They are made to move stuff from one place to another. They can haul dirt, rocks, gravel, sand, peanuts, popcorn, or even brownies. They can carry just about anything. Would you like to have a dump truck full of brownies? I would.



SKID-STEER

A skid-steer is small and fast. They have a little bucket on the front that can move a little bit of dirt really quickly. They can turn really sharp, so they are good in tight spaces.

SHEEPSFOOT

A sheepsfoot roller has a big heavy wheel on the front that is used to work the dirt. Most of the time they are used to smash the dirt down, so it's nice and tight.



BUSY

Right now these machines are hard at work at Still Waters, so the next time we have a camp it will be even more awesome than before!

EXCAVATOR

An excavator is great for digging giant holes and ditches. They have tracks instead of wheels that help them to stay stable while they are digging, and keep them from getting stuck in the mud. The long arm is super strong. It can reach down and grab a huge pile of dirt in one swipe.



WATER TRUCK

A water truck is sort of like a dump truck that holds water. Construction workers don't drink the water, but they use it for all kinds of other things, like spraying the dirt so it doesn't get too dusty!



A bulldozer is really powerful. Its job is to push dirt around. It has tracks like a tank, so it hardly ever gets stuck. They have really powerful engines that help them push a whole lot of dirt out of the way. They are great for clearing land for a road.

FRONT-END LOADER

A front-end loader is a powerful machine used to scoop up things and put it somewhere else. A lot of times they are used to load up dump trucks with stuff like dirt and gravel. If you had a huge pile of brownies it could load those too.

BIG MACHINES

-  There is a front-end loader called the LeTourneau L-2350 that is over 66 feet long!
-  The BelAZ 75710 dump truck weighs almost 900 tons. That's about 2 million pounds!
-  The Bagger 288 is an excavator that is also the largest machine in the world. It stands 311 feet tall, 705 feet long, and weighs 45,500 tons!

Nehemiah

When the prophet Daniel was just a boy, the Israelites were taken as prisoners of the people of Babylon. As the years passed, some Hebrews ascended to high power in the Babylonian Kingdom. One of those people was Nehemiah.

Even though it had been many years since the Babylonians had taken the Hebrews away from their home, Nehemiah was still very concerned about those who had escaped the captivity. Word had gotten back to him that those who had escaped years ago were suffering in Jerusalem. Nehemiah was the King's cupbearer, so he got to see the king pretty often. Maybe he would get the chance to speak to him about his brothers and sisters who were suffering.

Finally, one day, Nehemiah got his chance. The king asked Nehemiah why he was so sad. He told the king that the Hebrew city of Jerusalem was in ruins and the people there were suffering. Then Nehemiah asked him if he would let him to travel to Jerusalem to rebuild it. The king granted Nehemiah's request and sent him on his way to rebuild the great Hebrew city.



Nehemiah knew that it wasn't going to be easy. There were people around Jerusalem who didn't like the Hebrews, and didn't want them to rebuild their city. When two men named Sanballat and Tobiah heard that Nehemiah was coming to check on the children of Israel, they were not happy. At first they just made fun of him and his Hebrew construction workers. They called them mean names and said the wall they were building was weak, not even strong enough to hold up a fox.

Nehemiah and his workers didn't let it bother them, but soon Sanballat's insulting words turned into threats. Nehemiah stood strong; he turned to God and prayed. The Hebrews armed themselves with sharp swords, strong spears, and powerful bows. They stood guard all night long, and even when they did sleep they slept in their clothes, just in case they were attacked. Half the workers were made into full-time guards, and the rest of the workers had to carry a weapon with them wherever they went.

The Hebrews stayed organized and Nehemiah kept them all working hard, but their enemies didn't give up either. They tried to trick Nehemiah, but he was too wise for them. They made up lies about him, but Nehemiah defended himself and said they weren't true. They even tried to trap him by saying he needed to hide from the bad guys, but Nehemiah knew it was a trap and he didn't fall for it.

After tons of work in a very dangerous place, the wall was finally done. Nehemiah and his construction worker-warriors had finished! It was a great day for the Hebrew people. They celebrated in the best way they could: they read the Word of God and repented of their sins!

Nehemiah was a good man with a burden on his heart to rebuild the city of Jerusalem and help the Hebrew people. God used him to lead the construction workers and stand firm against their enemies. With God's help, Nehemiah overcame his enemies and rebuilt the walls of Jerusalem!

An architect is someone who draws the plans for something to be built. The builder is the one who builds it.

Whether you are building a house, a sky-scraper, a space ship, or a boat, there needs to be an architect and a builder.

One time, God Himself was the architect of a huge boat, and He chose a good man named Noah to build it.

It all started when God had become unhappy about the way people were acting. Everything the people were doing was evil and ungodly. Nobody seemed to love God anymore; nobody except Noah.

God looked down at the evil that was in the people and decided to destroy the whole

earth with a great flood. He only wanted Noah and his family, and the animals to survive. So God taught Noah how to build a giant boat that was big and strong enough to make it through the terrible flood.

The boat was to be huge: 300 cubits long, 50 cubits wide, and 30 cubits tall.

BRANHAM building the TABERNACLE



It was the year 1933. Franklin D. Roosevelt had just been elected president of the United States, and the American flag only had 48 stars on it.

It was a much different time than we live in now. The country was struggling through the Great Depression, and times were tough. There were no such things as computers, iPads, cell phones or internet. Even things like air conditioning and microwaves had not caught on yet.

Brother Branham was only 24 years old, but he knew what he had to do. He had a calling in his life to be a minister of the Gospel of Jesus Christ!

Brother Branham's congregation

was growing; he realized that he would need a permanent building really soon. But how would he do it? It was during the Great Depression, and very few people had jobs that paid enough to help support a new building.

God found a way to do it. People started coming in with their tithes and offerings, and Brother Branham put his with theirs. With the help of a Catholic friend of Brother Branham's, the City of Jeffersonville signed off on the project, and the people went to work.

On the morning that construction began, the Lord gave Brother Branham a vision. "This is not your tabernacle."

"Where is it, Lord?" Brother Branham replied.

Then the Lord set Brother Branham under the sky and started to tell him things that would take place in the future. Brother Branham wrote down the vision and took it with him to the work site. That afternoon he laid it in the cornerstone of the new church.

That same day, Brother Branham's granddad, along with many others started to build the Branham Tabernacle. It wasn't long before they were wrapping up the finishing touches. It was a simple building, but a very important one. Thousands would receive their healing there. The dead would raise there, and most importantly, God's Words would be spoken there.

Today we have hundreds of tapes that were preached at the little Branham Tabernacle, located at the corner of 8th and Penn Streets in Jeffersonville Indiana. Would you have liked to see Brother Branham preach in the tabernacle? Wouldn't it be fun to go back in time and see him preaching in his own church for the first time? He would be preaching the same Word of God that he always preached!

Beavers are actually huge rodents - sorta like a giant mouse whose tail got stepped on by an elephant.

Beavers work all winter long, even if the lake is completely frozen over.

They have special valves in their noses and ears that close up when they go underwater.



A beaver's front teeth stick out when his mouth is closed. This helps them to work under water without swallowing water.



A beaver's teeth never stop growing. Good thing they love to eat tree bark, otherwise their teeth would get way too long!

Beavers are herbivores. They like to eat leaves, bark, twigs, roots, and other water plants.

They are nocturnal - so they do most of their work at night.





A big beaver can be more than 3 feet long and weigh 60 or more pounds!

- A group of beavers is called a "colony."
- The entrances to their lodges are underwater!
- A beaver's rear feet are webbed, like a duck's, to help it swim better.
- A beaver's fur is oily and waterproof!

Beavers have an extra (see through) eyelid that helps them see underwater.

Beavers can stay underwater for 15 minutes!

- Beavers paddle their tails while they swim, to move faster in the water.

Baby beavers are called "kits."

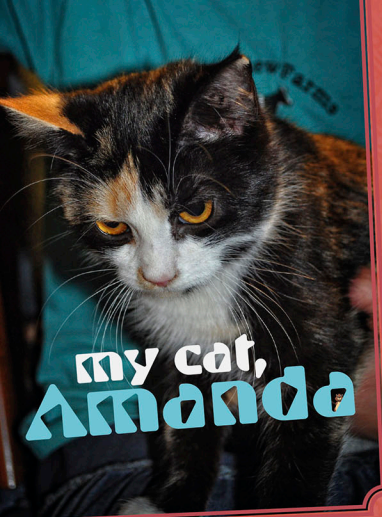


Beaver homes are called "lodges."
